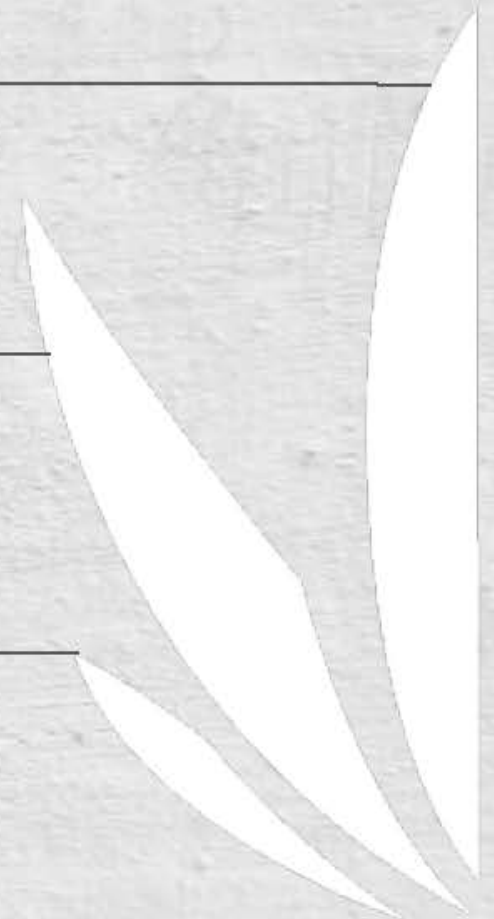

Impact Statement **2021** Jordan

Since the establishment of Ruwwad in Jordan, **1,335** young men and women benefited from the scholarship funds in our centers in East Amman\Jabal Al-Natheef, Tafileh and Beidha in southern Jordan. The number of our graduates, who have completed at least two years' journey in our enrichment programs, reached **885**. They worked as volunteers in our programs with children and parents, and participated in our enrichment programs and community campaigns.

189 young men and women benefited from university scholarships in East Amman\Jabal Al-Natheef, Tafileh and Beidha during 2021, they provided **24,690** hours of community service, the equivalent of more than **3,000** work days, in which they worked with children, adolescents and parents, throughout the year.

Impact Statement 2021



- Ruwwad supported more than **1,600** families during 2021 through the Community Support Program with its various components.



- Our youth in East Amman\Jabal Al-Natheef and Tafileh launched **19** community initiatives under their leadership, Directly touching the lives of **1,364** members of the community, in addition to 6040 indirect beneficiaries.

Impact Statement 2021

- Ruwwad worked with different partners on **5** empowerment projects during 2021, benefiting **2,208** male and female citizens in our marginalized neighborhoods directly, and **6,775** male and female citizens indirectly.
- Our projects also contributed to creating **556** job opportunities in East Amman, Tafleeh, and Ajloun.
- During 2021, Ruwwad worked with **89** local, regional and international partners, and **57** external volunteers took the initiative to participate in our work with the community.

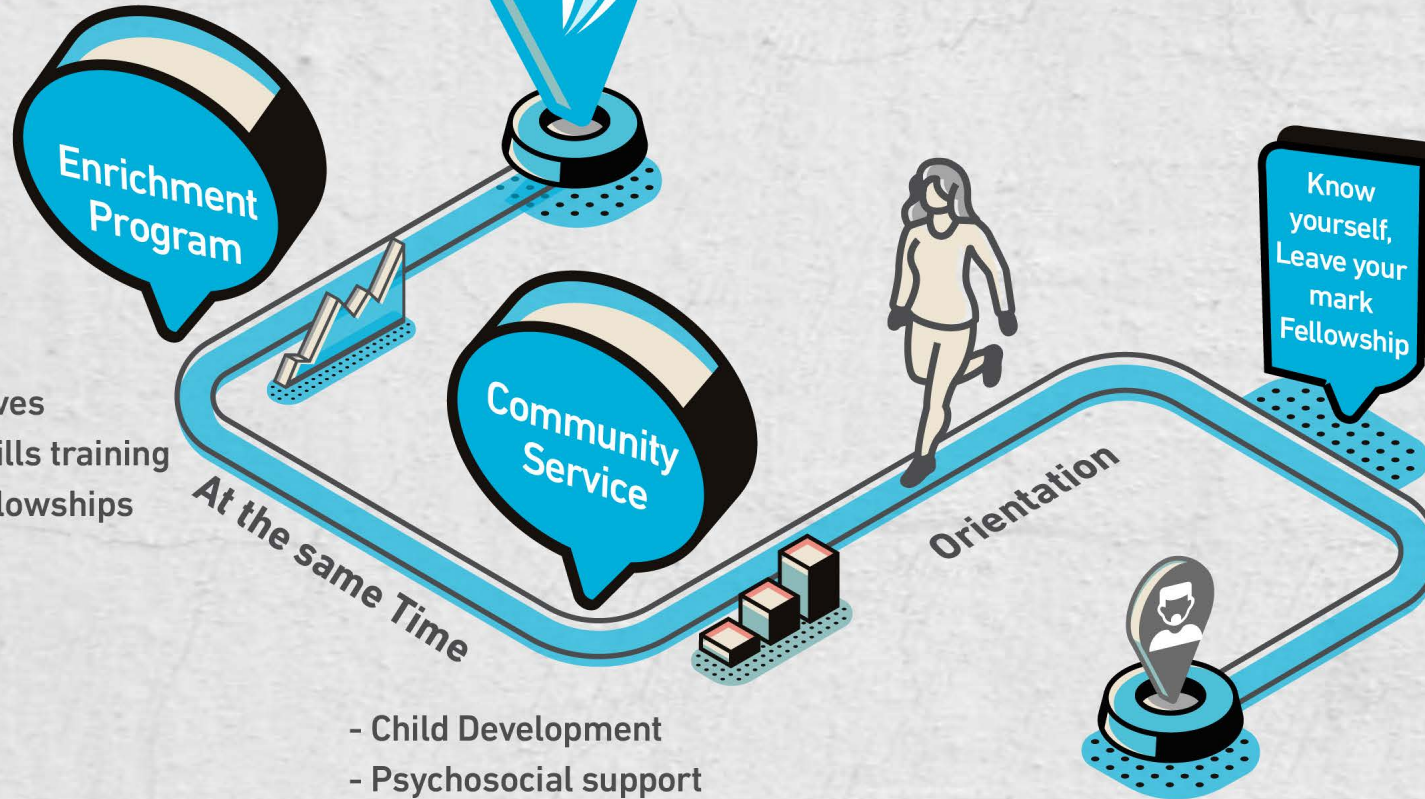

- Getting final approval from greater Amman municipality for the new building.

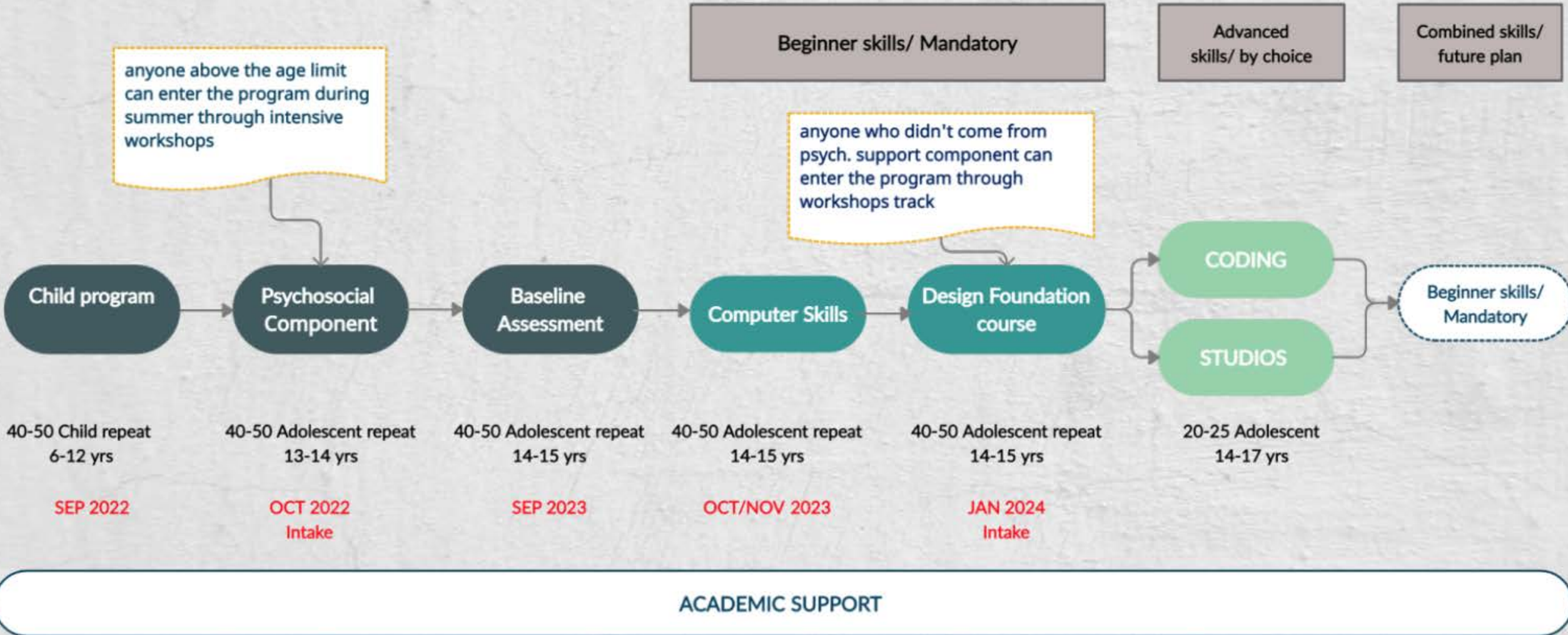

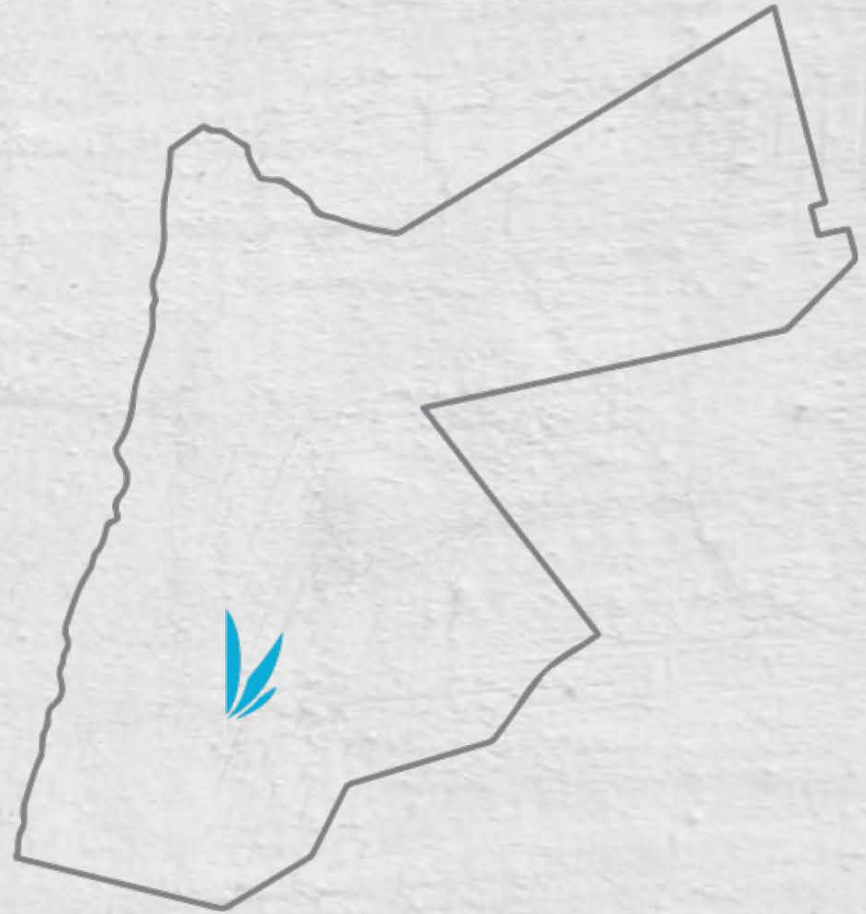
Tafileh Updates 2021

- Scholarship was delayed to accommodate large number of new scholars, and an orientation component has been added.



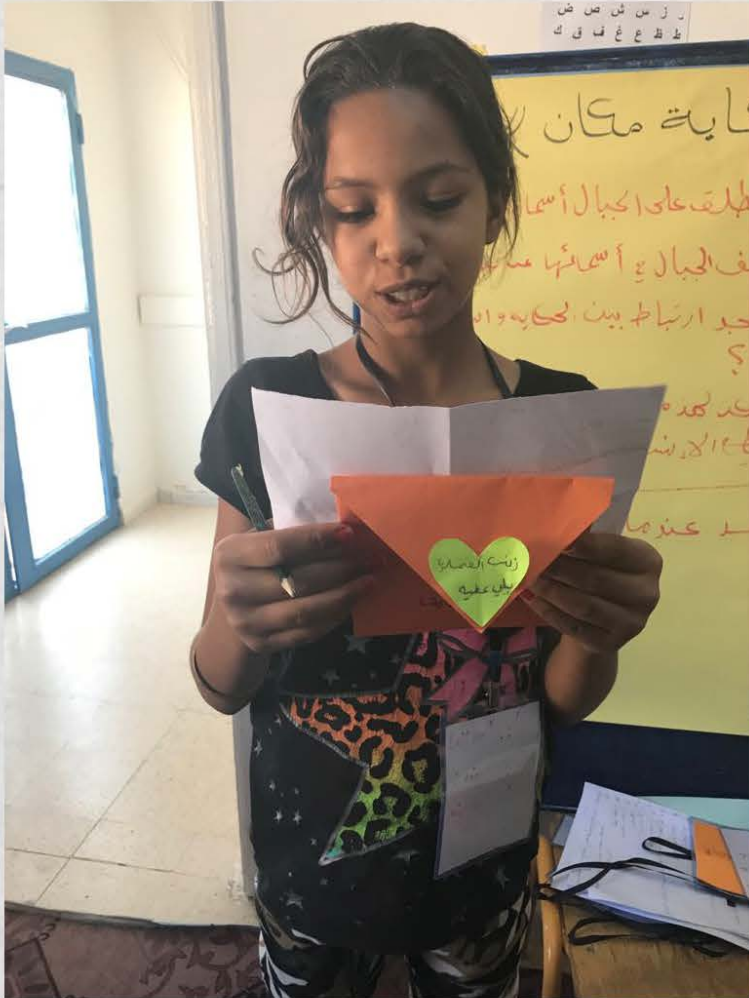

COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT

To improve community-based protection practices of refugee and host communities of Al Natheef and Al Mareekh in East Amman

Main Achievements

- **5** Community Facilitators, **3** of which are Jordanians and **2** are Syrians, were recruited and their capacity was built in the areas of Community Organizing, Human Rights - Based Approach, Facilitation Skills and Information Technology to improve community based protection practices and We facilitate access to the affected people by cases of violence.
- The CFs formed the first leadership team, for Siraj II Campaign , **15** youth scholars and **6** women were selected to form the first leadership team.
- The team succeeded to reach out to **208** people through one to one meetings to be part of 2nd tier leadership teams
- Partnerships were established with specialized organizations for the purposes of fully achieving the project objectives and to facilitate access to specialized services to benefit target beneficiaries.

Expanding the digital sector and digital government services in Jordan "GrowJo" 2021 GrowJo



! The project team conducted awareness and info sessions, and successfully reached out to 636 community members to raise the awareness about the GIG economy.

! Through a thorough selection process, **718** candidates - youth (%68 women and %15 Syrian refugees) participants were selected to benefit from onboarding and upskilling activities so they can access the GIG economy.



Monitoring and Evaluation 2021



- M&E capacity building workshops conducted in for teams in Amman, Tafleh, Palestine and Egypt on the basics of monitoring and evaluation, building logical framework and drafting and measuring indicators.
- Logical framework revised for Jordan and built for Ruwwad Palestine and Ruwwad Egypt.
- Reporting templates revised regionally to include indicators from the logical framework.
- All M&E tools that measure framework indicators compiled regionally.
- All beneficiaries' journeys revised with programs.

Monitoring and Evaluation Regional Training 2021

- 4 days M&E regional training conducted on data collection tools and data analysis.
- The first day included the basics and ethical and technical consideration of data collection and data analysis.
- The following days were divided per regional program, tools were displayed, analyzed and modified.
- Outcome of the training was the compilation of all regional tools and list of best practices in tools building.



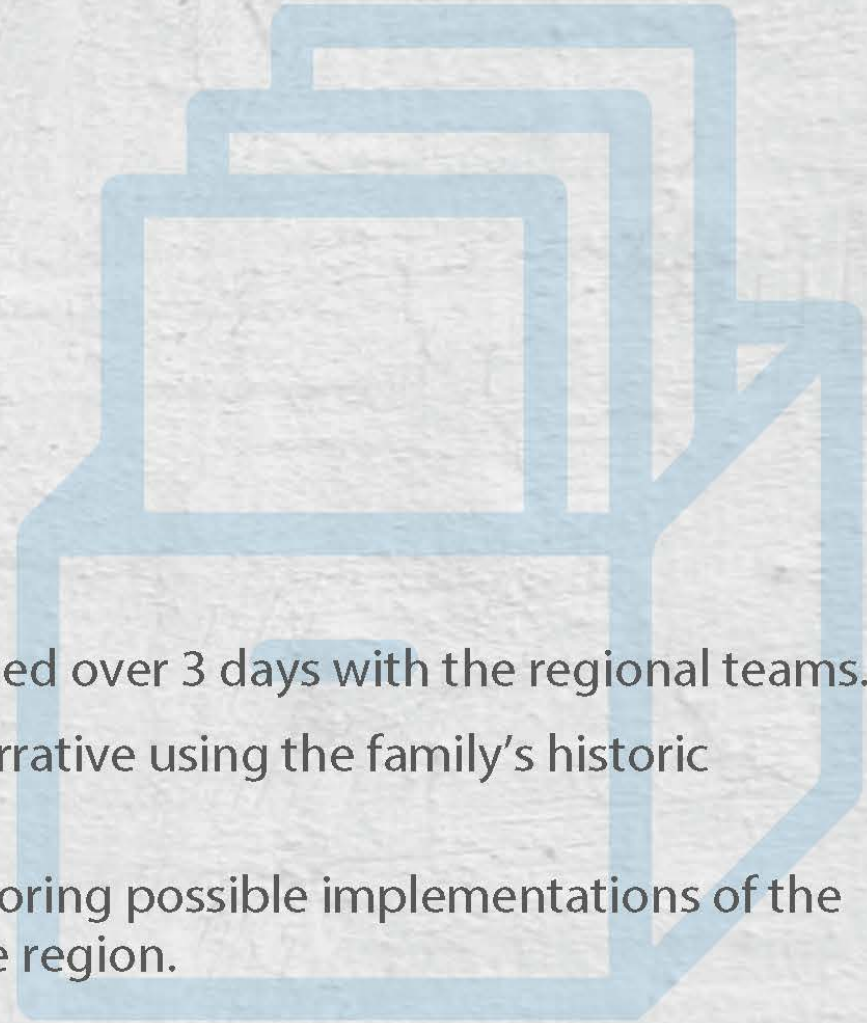
Inquiry Based Learning Regional Training 2021

- Needs assessment was conducted with the regional child program practitioners who apply the inquiry-based learning methodology.
- Based on the results of the needs assessment, the regional training was conducted over 3 days including a revision of the methodology, an emphasis on evaluation and creation of the cycle, and child motivation.
- 2 IBL case studies were introduced in the training that the teams worked on regionally.
- The outcome of the training is for each regional team to produce an IBL unit on nature to be implemented in 2022.



Family Archive Regional Training 2021

- Family Archive regional training was conducted over 3 days with the regional teams.
- The training focused on creating personal narrative using the family's historic documents, photos and artifacts.
- The training is an experimental phase of exploring possible implementations of the family archive in the child program across the region.
